

Forester's Report 11 30 2017

There were four burning permits issued during November. Burning permits continue to be available but with a recommendation not to use them when dry leaves cover the ground. At this point waiting for winter snow to cover the ground before burning a brush pile is a better idea.

American plum, chokecherry, nannyberry viburnum, hazelnut, red oak, black cherry, and Autumn Blaze maple trees were planted along Salem Church Road (near wildflower plantings) and in Musser Park (north meadow).

Both Horseshoe Lake and Sunfish Lake have been iced over and partially opened again twice this fall.

The pruning and dead tree removal along Angell Road by SaveATree company was completed on Tuesday, November 28. The project was completed as specified.
